



YOUTH DEVELOPMENT AND LEADERSHIP PROGRAMS

HELLO & WELCOME

Youth Development and Leadership Program (YDLP) at IAWAH guides youth on a journey toward becoming great people; centered in Christ and grounded in His truth. In these challenging programs, participants can expect to explore topics in:

- work habits and skills
- community life
- personal character development
- spiritual formation.

Participants generally begin at the end of Grade 8 with RISE and continue through CREW and ROOTs in subsequent summers. Year four of YDLP offers a cross-cultural experience called REACH--where participants continue to enhance their leadership skills.

While the programs build on each other, there are no program completion prerequisites.

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LEADERSHIP TRAINING

RISE participants experience an introduction to how camp works. Participants develop new skills through practical experience by learning how to design and run a program, experience cabin leading while shadowing one of our Jump Start camp leaders, and run an exciting evening activity.

CRITERIA

A desire to learn about camp in a team environment. The program is ideal for mature young people willing to live in community and are open to exploring their leadership potential through experiences in the daily workings of camp life. Participants can expect to go deeper in Biblical studies as they learn together.

CREW GROWTH THROUGH SERVICE

Completed Grade 9 | Age 14-15

CREW plants God's truth and establishes a good work ethic in youth that will serve them well as they grow. Youth in CREW learn life skills through activities, work shifts, study, and hands-on experiences. By learning how to work as a team, they develop skills in: teamwork, perseverance, conflict management, problem-solving, and resilience.

CREW isn't all work! Participants look forward to evening events, exclusive time spent at the ski & board dock, daily swims, and CREW only climbing times on the indoor wall. The Canoe trip or Hiking trip are highlights as well.

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CRITERIA

A desire to develop healthy work habits; willingness to work and live in a Christian community; a desire to form Godly character; willingness to engage God's Truth and experience biblical teaching.

ROOTs BUILDING PERSONAL CHARACTER

Completed Grade 10 | Age 15-16

ROOTs cultivates and builds personal character. Participants can choose from a number of focuses: Altitude (Hiking), Voyageur (Glamping), Vélo (Bike Packing) and Wild (Canoeing).

Participants grow their character through personal/team challenges, and opportunities to practice and serve children/youth through organizing and running the IAWAH day camp.

Regardless of the focus chosen, participants will receive the same Scripture-based curriculum and will put into practice what they learn in the context of their chosen area.

FOUR DISTINCT STREAMS

ROOTs River (max. 8 participants)

ROOTs River takes participants on an incredible journey in single seat sea kayaks. Over the course of the trip, the group will explore flatwater rivers and enjoy camping in some of the most picturesque places in Eastern Ontario.

ROOTs Wild (max. 12 participants)

For those that love the outdoors and a more challenging canoe trip, the team will venture out for 9 days. An extended lake/river trip provides the water conditions necessary for learning the right foundations for participants to consider becoming trip guides in the IAWAH context or elsewhere. The wilderness provides a natural structure and rhythm in which to learn.

ROOTs Altitude (max. 12 participants)

We begin with a few days of preparation and skills development before heading on an exciting outdoor adventure in the Adirondacks, NY. Participants will plan their own route, and learn essential camping, hiking, and mountaineering skills such as map reading and trip leading. ROOTs Altitude is an excellent introduction and foundation for those interested in leadership though experiential and outdoor education for teaching camp activities.

ROOTs Vélo (max. 6 participants)

What's bikepacking you ask? Think of a hiking trip, but instead of carrying the weight on your back, the gear is distributed on your bike. (IAWAH provides bikes and gear)

For those that love riding rail trails and backcountry roads, ROOTs Vélo is for you. Beginning with preparation at camp, participants will travel as a small group, and experience the outdoors, with a view from behind the handlebars. Camping along the way, Vélo participants will establish daily rhythms and learn to tackle challenges as a bikepacking team. Days will involve 4-5 hours of pedaling with lots of stops along the way.

The ROOTS program is a well established, in fact it has been going so long our participants have parents who attended it. Throughout the years the program has transformed to better reflect the needs of today's youth.

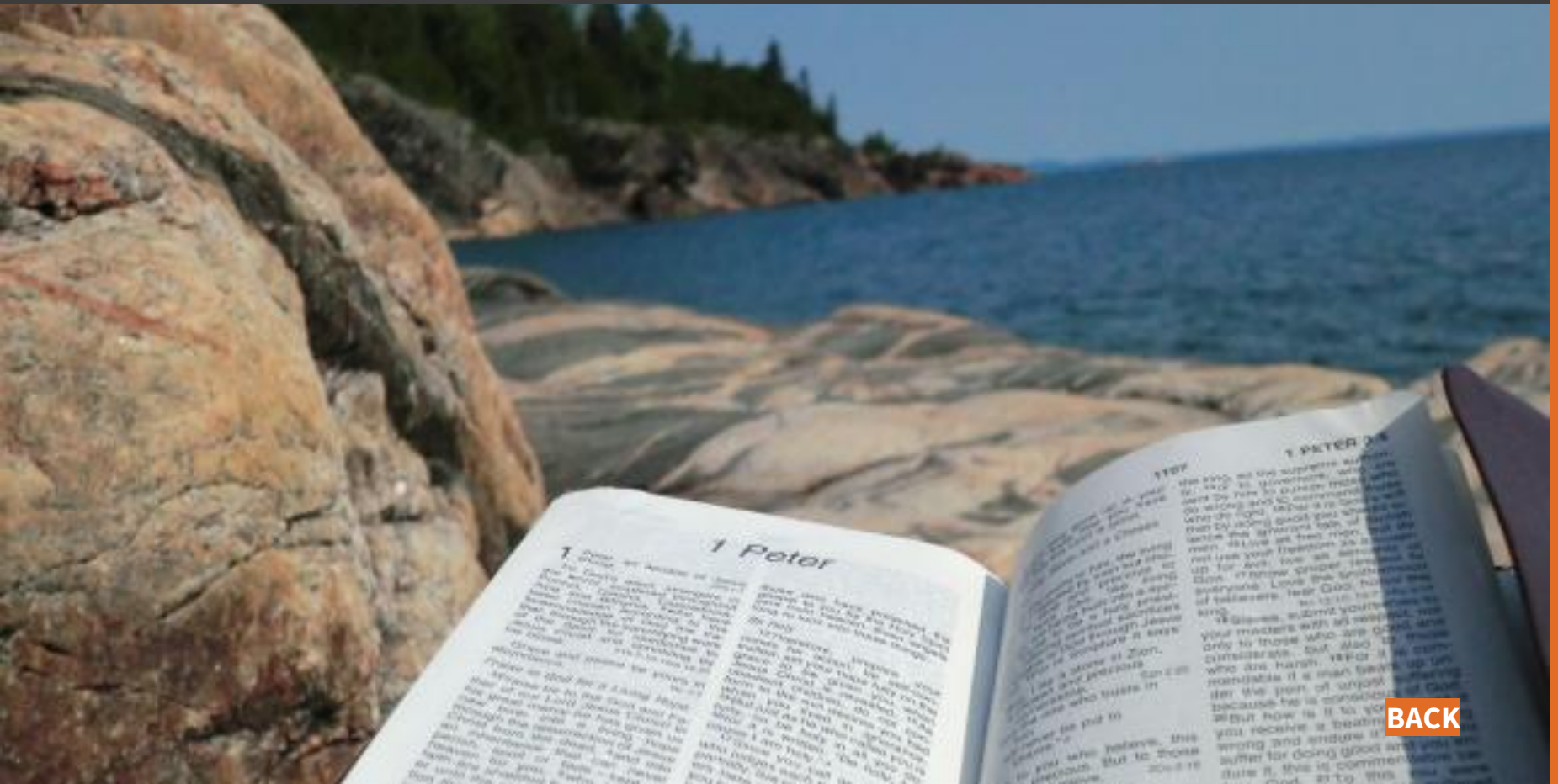

ROOTs is a very active, experience lead program. Participants look forward to physical challenges, team building activities, and time spent in smaller groups on their trips. The ROOTs vs. Staff IAWAH-ball game is always a highlight too.

Special Opportunity Post-ROOTs

Participants will have the opportunity to apply to stay on as “Staff in Training”, and work on a project at camp. Only a few spots are available each week. You will be supervised by a member of our YDLP team, work during the day (volunteer hours counted) and participate in staff meetings and staff activities.



CRITERIA

- Desire to serve in Christian community with a focus toward working with children
- Desire for spiritual maturity - being willing to engage God's Truth and experience biblical teaching
- Willingness to develop skills and abilities in a variety of areas.
- Willingness to be challenged spiritually, socially, intellectually and physically.

REACH EXPANDING HORIZONS

Completed Grade 11 | Ages 16-22

REACH enhances leadership skills in a cross-cultural context. Participants will further increase their understanding of service while working in partnership with ministries in Colombia and missionaries of Latin America Missions Canada (LAMCAN). The group will join local ministry staff and Colombian youth, as we develop and run a camp and assist in their programs. The experience will challenge participants holistically, through experiencing a new culture, camping and hiking, leading through camping ministry and serving in partnership with Colombian youth of the same age. We finish off our time in learning how God is working in the city of Barranquilla through visiting and participating in various strategic ministries to Venezuelan refugees.

TWO DISTINCT STREAMS

In Latin America, the group will join the local staff and church, as we prepare and assist in their programs. During our second week, we will take on a physical challenge through an incredible mountain hike. We finish off our time in learning how God is working in the cities through visiting and participating in various strategic ministries to students and the most vulnerable.

In Canada, we will be partnering with Bethel Church Kingston to provide a more successful experience for all. The team will head to Constance Lake where we will spend time getting to know the community, learning through listening and preparing for some time of service alongside community leaders. After this, the team will travel to the shores of Lake Superior National Park for some canoe tripping and/or hiking and exploring culturally and historically significant First Nation sites.

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LEADERSHIP TRAINING

The REACH program gives participants a chance to experience different cultures through immersion. Working directly with peers from Colombia, the shared experience teaching all participants to take their leadership skills to the next level.

CRITERIA

- Completed grade 11 / entering grade 12 and a min. age of 16 years old.
- Be in good physical and mental health to take on the demands of this program.
- Must have international medical insurance that includes emergency evacuation.
- Must be up to date on routine vaccinations
- A passport that does not expire within 6 months of the last date of the program.
- Must sign the waiver form.
- Spanish Language training is not required. The camp we will run alongside our Colombian counterparts will be in an English immersion program.

Completion of CREW or ROOTs is not a requirement. Participation in the program is not a requirement to work as staff at IAWAH. You may work as staff for part of the summer and still participate in Reach.

APPLICATION PROCESS

RISE Registrations are accepted on a first come first serve basis.

CREW Each CREW applicant will be screened for suitability for the program and processed by date received.

This may include contacting reference(s) provided. We cannot guarantee your first choice for either session or trips, but always do our best to meet those requests.

ROOTs Applications will be processed by date received. Each ROOTs applicant will be screened for suitability and may include contacting references listed. If selected, you will receive an email requesting an interview conducted through Google Meets or Zoom.

REACH Submit the completed application. Applications will be processed in order of date received. More info on the program and process will be provided from there.

GUIDELINES FOR YDLP PARTICIPANTS

Understanding that there is a time to set aside certain things in our lives for the purposes of learning, growing and experiencing different things, IAWAH expects that participants, while enrolled, will: participate in healthy, God-honouring relationships;

- set aside starting “to date” while participating in an IAWAH program;
- adhere to IAWAH standards on tech use. For all campers - including Crew and Roots - IAWAH is a NO CELL PHONE zone;
- avoid situations and circumstances that compromise integrity;
- present themselves in a manner that respects and values themselves and the rest of the community;
- be law-abiding citizens, including abstinence from alcohol, marijuana, illegal and non-prescription drugs and substances;
- fully participate, respect curfew, be punctual, value the privacy and dignity of others;
- abide by rules that may be implemented during the Program—there will be situations and circumstances where specific rules may be implemented.
